- The 2015-16 Ribault High School Girls Basketball Team went 30-1, with the only loss on the season being a three-point setback to Flagler Palm Coast.
- The Lady Trojans averaged 69.8 points per game, while opponents averaged 34.0 points per game. For the season, Ribault tallied 2,163 total points, more than doubled the total of its opposition (1,055 total points)
- Ribault High School is the fourth Florida girls basketball team in eight years to win the Dick's Sporting Goods High School Nationals. Miami Country Day won the title in 2015, while Dr. Phillip's (Orlando) won it in 2011 and 2013.
- At the 2016 Dick's Sporting Goods High School Nationals, Ribault High School was one of two teams -- boys and girls -- invited to the tournament that is a public school. The other school was Miller Grove (Ga.) in the boys tournament. Miller Grove is part of the DeKalb County School District, just outside of Metro Atlanta. Miller Grove was seeded sixth and fell 47-46 in the semifinals to eventual champion Oak Hill Academy (Va.)
- Head coach **Shelia Seymore-Pennick**, who is a DCPS alumnae (Nathan Forrest/Westside High School Class of completed her 12th season as head coach of the Lady Trojans, and has a 117-10 record from the last four years. During those last four years, Ribault has won three of the last four state championships.
- Of the four seniors on this year's team, Nola Carter and Kayla Rogers are the only seniors to have played at the varsity level all four years.

- Both **Rennia Davis** and **Day'Neisha Banks** are vying for invitations to the U18 Team USA trials that take place May 27-31 at the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo.
- -Rennia Davis scored 20+ points in both games at the 2016 Dick's Sporting Goods High School Nationals. For the season, Davis recored 20+ points in 19 games, including a pair of 29-point outings against First Coast (Nov. 25, Won 93-26) and Tallahassee Florida A&M (Dec. 12, Won 59-50). Davis averaged 20.3 points per game for the season.
- Most of Ribault's made field goals were from inside the three-point arc (710 of 857 made field goals).
- Four-year varsity team member **NoIa Carter** has been the team's captain since the 10th grade.
- Junior **Rennia Davis** registered an award-filled season: Third-Team All-America (*USA Today*), All-Tournament at the 2016 Dick's Sporting Goods High School Nationals, 2016 FABA 5A Player of the Year, 2016 FACA Player of the Year, 2016 "Dairy Farm" Player of the Year, All-Conference, All-District, and MVP.
- Junior **Day'Neisha Banks** could be a future coach in the making. As one of her extracurricular activities, Banks helps her middle school basketball coach at Highlands Middle School.
- Sophomore **Idamar Mojica**, junior **Rennia Davis**, and senior **Kayla Rogers** are all in the early college program at Ribault High School. Duval County Public Schools offers several accelerated learning programs throughout the district. The Early College Program blends high school and college courses to enable students to earn a high school diploma and an Associates degree with minimal financial cost. In grades 11 and 12, Early College students are enrolled full time at Florida State College at Jacksonville (FSCJ).
- Meanwhile, juniors **Day'Neisha Banks**, **Lakeisha Battles**, **LaQuanza Glover**, and **LeTerra Ransom** are all Dual Enrollment students. Dual Enrollment is another high school acceleration program offered by DCPS. Dual enrollment provides students in 11th and 12th grades the opportunity to enroll in postsecondary courses creditable toward high school completion and an Associate's or Bachelor's degree.
- Academics is a big part of being a STUDENT-athlete. Both seniors **NoIa Carter** and **Praise Russell** rank in the Top 20 of Ribault's Class of 2016 (Carter is No. 4, Russell is No. 20).
- Senior **Tiara Hutchinson** might be a multi-sport athlete (basketball, volleyball, softball, and flag football), but she is also involved in ROTC, an activity she has done since her freshman year. During a physical training exercise, Hutchinson placed third out of 230 girls. If she does not end up playing basketball in college, she hopes to become an officer in the U.S. Army or the U.S. Marine Corps.
