DEFENDANT'S INVOCATION OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

- The Undersigned, Gloria Williams, having been advised that I have been arrested on felony charges in Colleton County, South Carolina, pursuant to an arrest warrant issued in the County of Duval, Florida, do hereby invoke my right to remain silent under the 5th Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 9 of the Florida Constitution.
- 2. Furthermore, I do hereby invoke my right to counsel guaranteed by Article I, Sections 2, 9, and 16 of the Florida Constitution; Rule 3.130, Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure; and the 5th and 6th Amendments of the United States Constitution, as interpreted by the United States Supreme Court in Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S. 436 (1966), Edwards v. Arizona, 451 U.S. 675 (1981) and the Florida Supreme Court in Traylor v. State, 596 So. 2d 957 (Fla. 1992).
- 3. By invocation of my foregoing right to counsel, I intend this to be an absolute expression of my desire for the assistance of an attorney in dealing with any custodial interrogation by law enforcement of any agency about this arrest and the

charges or any other crime or criminal activity under investigation, where I am a

suspect or witness.

4. Therefore, I, Gloria Williams, demand that no local, state, or federal police or

prosecution personnel (including jail inmates acting at the request or direction of such

personnel) attempt to engage me in any conversation whatsoever, concerning any

crime or criminal activity, whether presently charged or not, without the presence of

one of my attorneys. Any person connected with law enforcement who allows a

violation of these rights to occur shall be viewed as interfering with my

attorney/client privilege and relationship as protected by the Florida and United States

Constitutions and by the Rules of Professional Conduct for attorneys.

5. This invocation of rights shall not be deemed to have been waived by me unless and

until I execute a written waiver of these rights with the assistance of counsel, signed

by both myself and my attorney.

6. I further demand that this invocation of rights be placed into my jail file (at both

Colleton County and Duval County) so that anyone wishing to question me from any

agency will be on notice that I have invoked my right to remain silent and right to

counsel.
